The menu of the day was, as always, delightful from casseroles, to salads, to desserts to savor and linger over. No one left with any room for anything else that day, I'm sure.



- Informal Rug Show: Please bring a rug to share with us!
 There will be labels for you to pin to each item with name of rug hooker, designer & teacher. Rug and other sales outside of vendor spaces are prohibited.
- Door Prizes: We ask that participants bring a door prize for distribution to attendees. It can be anything an attendee might enjoy from wool to flowers to lotions to warm socks! Minimum \$10.00 value. If you bring a door prize you will get a door prize.
