NEW PROCESS FOR MANAGING MEETING LOGISTICS

Many of you were present at the May 2011 meeting when we discussed our thoughts on how to meet the growing demands associated with hosting our monthly programs. This is to clarify our new course of action. We appreciate all of your past efforts in helping our programs to go smoothly and thank you in advance for your on-going support!

Beginning this program year, logistics for each meeting will be coordinated by teams designated by color. Board members will assume responsibility for the first meeting on September 17th and will organize four teams on that date to rotate responsibility going forward. Each team will be responsible for two meetings over the course of any given program year and will be responsible for the tasks outlined below. Tasks will be coordinated for each team by a Team Leader.

At each meeting, the team responsible for the next month's meeting will convene briefly to insure that all the bases are being covered. The Team Leader will follow up by phone or e-mail prior to the meeting to remind people of what they signed up for. If a team member is unable to perform a task that they volunteered for, they should arrange for an alternate member of the team to fill in for them and notify the Team Leader in advance of the designated meeting.

Board members will assist team members in all activities and will provide guidance and support as needed.

All team members should arrive by 9:15 and will be responsible to bring snacks, drinks, a centerpiece and decorations as appropriate.
