Proceed 1/10th of a mile to the stop sign. Go another 1/10th of a mile and bear right at the fork/triangle onto Mill Street. (You'll see the Groton Police Department on your left and a huge white house with a white picket fence to your right as you make this turn.) Almost immediately, you'll see a yellow horse crossing sign on your right. (Put your right blinker on and slow down.) Immediately after passing the sign, turn right onto West Street at the mailboxes (turns quickly into a dirt road) then turn left onto Westbrook Lane (another dirt road – go slow, very bumpy). Edythe's house is about 350' down on the right (fist house you come to). It's a gray house set back from the road.
