Mayflower Chapter Welcomes Margaret Arraj



On May 18, 2013, the Mayflower Chapter had the pleasure of hosting Margaret Arraj of Mill River Rugs, who spoke in depth about her love for traditional hooking with rug wool yarn. She began by telling us that her Lebanese name means "one who deviates" and that she is currently working on rug # 112.

Margaret began rug hooking at age 12 after she convinced her mother to buy some material and taught herself how to complete her first crude rug on burlap from Montgomery Ward and Aunt Lydia's heavy rug yarn from the local Five and Dime.

However, it was another fifty years before Margaret truly began her rug hooking hobby. At that time, she and her husband took a rug hooking course at an adult education program. She credits her McGown trained teacher who supported her desire to "deviate" from the norm by being the only one who used yarn. In using wool yarn, she describes yarn as being "round, twisted, rebellious, which won't stand up the same way as strips which have an edge." She says she is still learning how to hook with yarn. Her favorite tools and materials include Cushing's fine linen (from Scotland, with square holes), medium weight 100% wool yarn, the puritan frame and a very fine Moshimer hook. She prefers very coarse rug wool, finding some of the best material from New Zealand.

As she described the many rugs she brought with her, Margaret's enthusiasm comes across. She likes

to keep her hooking pure – no marketing, etc, to distract her from hooking. She showed our group examples of bed rugs and explained these were the predecessor to what she does now. She has been collecting and selling rug wool yarn for quite some time and she likes the tradition of using leftovers from carpet factories.

As for design, Margaret specializes in historic and ethnic designs and is drawn to two-dimensional art. She likes the look of flat colors and showed us a variety of rugs. Her goat rug was made using actual mohair. She is drawn to Art Noveau designs, William Morris contemporaries, and Turkish, Asian and Persian designs.

Heidi Lee recently shared her rug journey with the Mayflower Chapter, which is summarized in her words below:

"A journey can begin anywhere, but my rug hooking journey began in 1999, when several friends encouraged me to join them in a class taught by Meredith LeBeau at the Beverly Senior Center. Meredith, a McGown certified teacher with an extensive history in the local hooking scene, helped me learn the techniques of hooking with a chair pad that required shading of strawberries, leaves and blossoms, and attention to finishing the edge. I was off and running!

Over the years, I have hooked patterns by others, and now I like to design my own patterns as well. Mostly, I hook pieces to decorate my home, but I am proud of my daughter's wedding rug that I designed and hooked recently featuring a landscape. I like using size 3-6 wool strips, and I will add in yarns when appropriated. I am looking forward to my first "Hooking School" experience at the ATHA North school where I was fortunate to win a scholarship from Region 1 ATHA to attend.

For me, the relaxing art of rug hooking not only supports my need to create every day, but the nice folks I meet along the way are a large part of my social network."

Rug Registry and Rug Exhibit

The first ever Rug Registry August 17-18 (Sat-Sun) will take place at the Shelburne Buckland Community Center at 53 Main Street, Shelburne Falls, 01370. The Rug Registry is a fairly new idea where rug hookers are encouraged to register information about their rugs for historical purposes. A similar project has been undertaken in the Quilting world and people can check that website at www.quiltindex.org to get a general idea of how this type of registry works. The Rug Registry is in its infancy and will require support in terms of software, but we think it will be an extremely valuable tool once it gets going. The cost to register a rug is \$10, and you will need to bring the form and the rug to the Shelburne Buckland Community Center August 17-18, 2013. Appointments to register a rug should be made ahead of time by contacting Diana O'Brien (see info below).

The Community Center will also be host to a hooked rug exhibit on August 17-18th and all ATHA chapter members are welcome to participate in the exhibit, or help out by demonstrating or helping with the Rug Registry. The exhibit is open to the public with a \$5.00 entrance fee, which is waived if you are registering a rug.
