➤ On June 1st, they will be having a rug show, which will be an opportunity for Mayflower members to show off their handiwork. You can bring your rug(s) to the show that day. However, if you're not available on June 1st but would like to show your work, please bring your rugs to the May meeting, and Eileen will get them there. If you attend the rug hooking group at the Peabody Council on Aging, you can also bring your rug(s) there and give them to Carol Stearn or Eileen.

<u>Note:</u> You need to include a tag on each piece you wish to display that includes the designer name (if known) and the hooker's name.

- They are still looking for people to help out and volunteer at the rug hooking demonstrations at least *once a year*. This is a good opportunity to show people what traditional rug hooking is, how it's done, and maybe even let them try hooking a few loops. In addition, it's an opportunity to get potential new members interested in joining Mayflower. If you're interested in volunteering, please reach out to Eileen for additional information.
- There is also an opportunity to do demonstrations at the Salem Witch House. Eileen is getting more information on this, but it will probably be held on Wednesdays or Saturdays, 11:00AM to 3:00PM. Again, if you're interested, contact Eileen.
