2024-2025 Challenge

This year, we are challenging you to make one or more mini-mats. The size is up to you, but we're thinking mats 4-6" square.

Please note that it has been suggested that you could do the 12 designs in a single mat, as Diane Hart has done here on the right.

The goal of this challenge is to encourage you to design a pattern of your own and quickly execute it. If you do several, your design skills will improve with each one. So, with that said, here are our themes to choose from:

- 1. Snowy scene
- 2. Abstract, using two colors
- 3. Circles
- 4. Critters in the Garden
- 5. Leaves
- 6. Paisley
- 7. Things that Fly

- 8. Things in the Sea
- 9. Quilt Block
- 10. Architecture



- 11. Birds
- 12. Landscape

The rules:

Well, there really aren't any. But here are some suggestions:

- Make your mat any size you wish, but remember, these are designed to be easy, quick projects.
- Use materials you already own. Given the small mat size, if you have a wealth of 8-cut noodles, you will probably want to cut them in half to allow you to work in a smaller scale than you normally do.
- You may make your mat any shape you wish...if you want to use some of them as ornaments, that might take you in some fun directions.
- Make as many of the themes as you wish. If there is one theme that excites you and you want to make several of that theme, please go ahead.
- You may make them in any order from the list you wish.
- You may hook, punch, embellish, or use any technique that you want to try. This challenge is designed to stretch your creative skills, so go for it!
- If you plan on making a few of these, you might want to use one piece of backing and hook your designs fairly close to each other (say 2" apart) to save on backing material. We will share techniques to finish them that don't require whipping

As you finish your mats, bring them for show and tell to inspire others. In the spring, we will invite everyone to bring theirs for a large show and tell






Some Highlights of Last Month's Speaker, Deana David

JURIED ART EXHIBIT The Arts Ministry at Christ the Redeemer Church in Danvers, MA

The theme for the show is Light Shines in the Darkness and it will run from May 18th through June 22nd The theme is *Light Shines in the Darkness*.

What does this mean?

Your hooked piece can be publicly shown in an art show. You also have the opportunity to sell it.

What should I do?

Hook a piece with the theme Light Shines in the Darkness. You interpret this any way you want; you're the artist!

What's the procedure?

There will be a call for submissions in April, 2025. You can submit more than one piece. You will take a photo of your work and through a link, submit it for the jury to consider. They will send information and submission forms on Facebook:

Light in the World Ministry

The jury will let you know if they accept your hooking for the show, or not. If it's accepted make sure the piece is ready for hanging (Framed, sleeved etc.). You will bring it in for the show and pick it up afterwards. It will be hung in the church hall. There's a reception on opening night with food and wine. Artists are encouraged to attend so that you might want to discuss your work with other attendees.

I am always amazed at the art people submit. There are established artists and first pieces chosen. The interpretation of the theme can be so unique. Past shows included oil, watercolor and acrylic paintings, quilt wall hangings (there's a size limit) cross stitch, calligraphy, pottery, furniture and rug hooking. But it's not just limited to these mediums. As long as your creation interprets the theme, they will consider it.

This is a great opportunity to show your works of art and place rug hooking on the wall of an art show!
